Fremantle Sailing Club is a not-for-profit sporting organisation that plays a key role in the Western Australian maritime community. It is the gateway to the Indian Ocean. An aquatic playground envied worldwide for the unique obstacle free expanse of water and consistent local winds.

Home to over 2,800 enthusiastic members of all ages, Fremantle Sailing Club is a community dedicated to the ocean.

The current Club site was developed in 1979 and covers 28 hectares of water and 6 of reclaimed land.

The Club has a proud history dating back to 1897 where it held races between Cutters along the Fremantle foreshore and the main harbour; and 1906 when it conducted the first ocean race from Mandurah to Bunbury.

Strong activities drive the club with events for enthusiasts year round: from learning to sail, to weekend cruises, world class regattas, to diving expeditions; twilight sails, to safety training; hooking a marlin, to beating a drum. There is an activity for everyone. These are conducted through well represented sections including:

ANGLING

- Monthly meetings for the promotion of fishing and lobbying for change.
- Regular competitions including mid week, weekends and interclub.
- Fishing clinics and Annual Leeman Fishing Week
- Many and varied social events.

BOSUNS

- Maintenance of Club boats and general facilities.

- Courses in Basic Navigation, Seamanship and Small Boat Operation.

CRUISING

- Learn more about your vessel and yourself whilst cruising in company to various destinations.
- Group day sails, weekend cruises, outport destinations.
- Mentors allocated to new Members.
- Discussion evenings on cruising topics.

DINGHY /JUNIOR RACING

- Learn to sail and race programs in school holidays.
- Fully supervised and qualified coaches teach in a safe environment for beginners.
- A variety of classes sailed to cater for all ages/skill levels.
- Racing during winter and summer with coaching sessions mid-week.
- Our sailors represent the club at local, national, international and Olympic level.

DIVE

- Great fellowship through varied activities including monthly local dives, bi-annual international dive trips, monthly meeting/topic nights and educational programmes.
- Jetty protection anode checking and replacement to ensure the long term life of our marina.
- Other varied activities around the club when divers required.

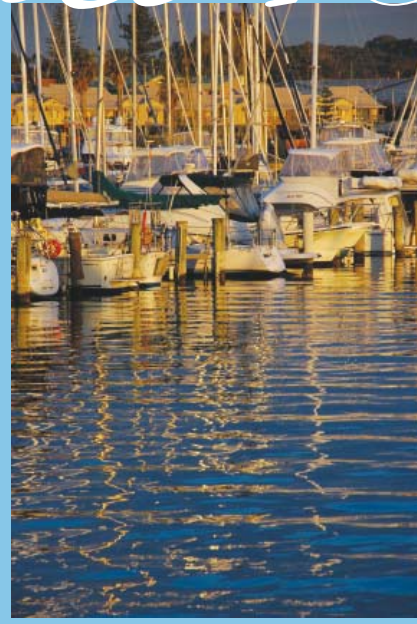
DUTY OFFICERS
